

Report of the meeting

- The first meeting of the Standing Committee on health emergency prevention, preparedness and response ("the Standing Committee") was held virtually on 12 December 2022. The officers of the Standing Committee were appointed, with Dr Noor Hisham Abdullah of Malaysia as Chair and Professor Jérôme Salomon of France as Vice-Chair.
- The Director-General provided the opening remarks, welcomed all participants and indicated that he looked forward to being advised and supported by the Standing Committee through the Executive Board
- 3. The Chair recalled the functions of the Standing Committee as per the terms of reference contained in decision EB151(2). The Secretariat then provided a background presentation on the WHO Health Emergencies Programme, including an overview of ongoing public health emergencies of international concern, and the relevant legislation and oversight mechanisms. A rich discussion followed, including questions and comments from Standing Committee members, as well as from Member States not represented on the Standing Committee. It was stressed that the work of the Standing Committee needed to be complementary and avoid duplication with other relevant processes.
- 4. Since the Standing Committee shall meet at least twice annually and provide a report of each of its meetings to the Executive Board (as per the terms of reference contained in decision EB151(2)), it was agreed that meetings could be scheduled in March or April to report to the Executive Board meeting convening after the World Health Assembly, and in October or November to report to the Executive Board meeting convening at the start of the calendar year. Preferably, at least one of those two meetings will be convened in person or in hybrid form; the meeting dates will be set by the Chair and the Vice-Chair, in consultation with the Director-General. Efforts will be made to take advantage of existing formal and informal meetings when scheduling the meetings of the Standing Committee. When a need arises, ad hoc emergency meetings need to be called.
- 5. The Standing Committee discussed the misalignment between the terms of membership of the Standing Committee, because of the timing of nominations in December, vis-à-vis the normal cycle of committee membership that usually aligns with the Health Assembly schedule. The Committee recommended that the Executive Board consider the matter at its next meeting.
- 6. The Standing Committee considered and adopted its meeting report. The meeting was closed.





Timeline of WHO Member State workstreams





Report of the Review Committee regarding amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005)

Report by the Director-General

The Director-General has the honour to transmit to the Working Group on Amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005) the report of the Review Committee regarding amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005) (see Annex) in accordance with decision WHA75(9) (2022).

The RC convened by the Director-General (DG) in compliance of 75 World Health Assembly: decision WHA75(9) and consistent with decision EB150(3) (2022), and in accordance with Article 50 of the IHR.

RC submitted its report to the DG in mid-January 2023 in accordance with Article 55 of the Regulations.

DG transmitted to the Working Group on Amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005) (WGIHR) Contained the review of 307 proposed amendments to the IHR submitted by State Parties



Strengthening WHO preparedness for and response to health emergencies

The Seventy-fifth World Health Assembly, having considered the report of the Member States Working Group on Strengthening WHO Preparedness and Response to Health Emergencies, ¹


Decided

- to welcome the report;
- (2) with respect to targeted amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005):
 - (a) to continue the Working Group on Strengthening WHO Preparedness and Response to Health Emergencies, with a revised mandate, including as appropriate and if agreed within each region, the rotation of the Bureau, and name (the "Working Group on Amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005)" (WGIHR)) to work exclusively on consideration of proposed targeted amendments to the International Health Regulations (2005), consistent with decision EB150(3) (2022), for consideration by the Seventy-seventh World Health Assembly in 2024;
 - (b) to request the Director-General to convene a Review Committee on the International Health Regulations (2005) (IHR Review Committee), as early as possible but no later than 1 October 2022, in accordance with Part IX, Chapter III, of the International Health Regulations (2005), in particular Article 50, paragraphs 1(a) and 6, with particular attention to be paid to the fulfilment of the letter and spirit of Article 51, paragraph 2, to make technical recommendations on the proposed amendments referred to in subparagraph (c) below, with a view to informine the work of the WGIHR:
 - (c) to invite proposed amendments to be submitted by 30 September 2022, with all such proposed amendments being communicated by the Director-General to all States Parties without delay;
 - (d) to request the WGIHR to convene its organizational meeting no later than 15 November 2022, and to coordinate with the process of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body (INB) to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response, including through regular coordination between the two Bureaus and alignment of meeting schedules and workplans, as both the International Health Regulations (2005) and the new instrument are expected to play central roles in pandemic prevention, preparedness and response in the future:




Conceptual zero draft for the consideration of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body at its third meeting
