
This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.

- Children and young adults have been infected with COVID-19, though at lower rates than older adults. While the vast majority have experienced mild or moderate (radiology confirmed pneumonia) disease, some have experienced severe or critical disease. Data from Korea, Italy and China have shown that mortality increases with older age—however, a few cases of young adults and children who have died of COVID-19 have been reported.
- While there have been media reports that COVID-19 may cause the loss of smell or taste, we do not know yet if this is a symptom of COVID-19. Many countries are systematically collecting information on the signs and symptoms, and some are using a protocol developed by WHO which will help to standardize and analyze this data. Based on this evidence-based approach, WHO anticipates having more information soon.
- Laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 patients who are cared for at home can be released from home isolation after testing negative twice using PCR testing with samples collected at least 24 hours apart. Where testing after isolation is not possible, WHO recommends that confirmed patients remain isolated for two weeks after symptoms resolve.
