
This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.

- There is currently insufficient information to confirm any link between tobacco or nicotine in the prevention or treatment of COVID-19.
- ➤ Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers. Tobacco smoking is a known risk factor for many respiratory infections and increases the severity of respiratory diseases.
- ➤ WHO urges researchers, scientists and the media to be cautious about amplifying unproven claims that tobacco or nicotine could reduce the risk of COVID-19. WHO stresses the importance of ethically approved, high-quality, systematic research that will contribute to advancing individual and public health, emphasizing that promotion of unproven interventions could have a negative effect on health.
- ➤ WHO is constantly evaluating new research, including research that examines the link between tobacco use, nicotine use, and COVID-19.


