

#### PAHO JAMAICA CO EOC - SITUATION REPORT #56

# NOVEL CORONAVIRUS-COVID-2019 – 5 MAY 2020 (as at 6:00 p.m.)

## **HIGHLIGHTS**

# 1. Jamaica:

- a. Confirmed cases: 473 (2 new)
  - 35 imported, 170 contacts of confirmed cases, 11 local cases-not epidemiologically linked, 257 under investigation, including 221 from a workplace cluster
  - ii. Sex: 182 M (38%) 291 F (62%)
  - iii. Age: Mean: 31 years / Median 26 years / Age range: 2 months 87 years
- b. Deaths: 9 (on 18 March, 31 March, 1 April, 7 April, 14 April, 20 April, 22 April, 23 April and 3 May 2020)
- c. Recovered: 57
- d. Isolation: 428 (total)
  - i. Of this total, 407 are confirmed cases in isolation:
    - 1. Hospitals: 52
    - 2. Transition facilities: 16
    - 3. National Isolation Facilities: 217
    - 4. Home: 122
- e. Samples tested: 5,993, of which 473 are positive, 5,467 negative and 53 pending
- f. Contacts: 3,378 (total), with 1,307 of these close contacts being followed
- g. Quarantine:
  - i. National Quarantine Facilities: 38
  - ii. Home quarantine: 2,005

# 2. Bermuda:

- a. Confirmed cases: 115 (0 new)
  - i. 38 imported, 66 local transmission, 11 under investigation
- b. Deaths: 7
- c. Recovered: 54
- d. Samples tested: 3,374, with 115 positive and 3,259 negative
- e. Quarantine (with public health supervision): 364
- f. A phased re-opening of Bermuda started as of 2 May 2020 Phase 1: Limited Business (with curfew from 10:00 p.m. 6:00 a.m.), Phase 2: Expansion of Services, Phase 3: Moving to Normal, Phase 4: New normal.

# 3. Cayman Islands:

- a. Confirmed cases: 78 (3 new), with 1 death reported
- b. Recovered: 30
- c. Samples tested: 2,752, with 78 positive and 2,674 negative
- d. There will be limited re-opening of some businesses and services as of 4 May 2020.

#### SITUATION OVERVIEW

Jamaica, Bermuda and the Cayman Islands started preparedness for any possible introduction of the novel coronavirus – COVID-19 in early January 2020, immediately following identification of the novel coronavirus on 7 January 2020 in China.



The respective national level Committees / Councils continue to guide all sectors in the required preparedness and response actions.

## **ACTIONS TAKEN:**

# Jamaica:

## - MOHW:

- 1. A new application for self-monitoring by persons in isolation and quarantine was implemented by the MOHW.
- 2. Additional isolation facilities have been identified to accommodate approximately 300 persons outside of hospital
- 3. Interim guidelines for the management of pregnant women completed and circulated.
- 4. Continue contact tracing, testing and quarantine of MOHW workers who are contacts of a confirmed case at the MOHW Head Office.
- Continue special containment measures for workers and contacts at identified Call Centres.
- 6. Further the planning and guidelines for lock-downs of parishes and possibly the country
- Escalate the identification of cases and contacts, contact tracing, establishment of
  national quarantine and isolation facilities and installation of equipment and materials for
  case management.
- 8. Expand community engagement and risk communication for persons in home quarantine and isolation.

#### - PAHO:

- 1. Planning and coordination
  - a. 24-hr technical guidance and support to the MOHW EOC and executive, focusing on coordination of health sector activities, re-organization of the health services, epidemiological surveillance, contact tracing, laboratory and case management.
  - Technical lead for COVID-19 response in collaboration with UNCT and International Development Partners
- 2. Risk Communication and Community Engagement
  - a. Mental Health literacy in schools programme in the context of COVID-19 has started with approval from the Ministry of Education.
  - b. The PAHO JAM CO provided the PAHO video on coping with stress and mental well-being during isolation and quarantine to the MOHW for use in their public education programme.
- 3. Resource mobilization
  - a. Lead of Health Sector Group for resource mobilization and coordination of partners / donors in collaboration with the Government of Jamaica-Ministry of Foreign Affairs and within the UNCT.
  - Hand-over of laboratory test kits and extraction kits for the National Influenza Centre (NIC) by the PWR to MOHW – 4 May 2020
  - c. Hand-over of 25 android tablets for surveillance, focusing on Go.Data for contact tracing and enzymes for the NIC by PWR to MOHW 25 April 2020
  - d. Submission of UN SG COVID-19 Response and Recovery MPTF by UNCT 24 April 2020 – PAHO and UNFPA are RUNOs in collaboration with UNAIDS in Window 1, with PAHO proposal included.





- e. PWR brief to Donor Group UNCT, Diplomatic community and International Development Partners chaired by Ministry of Foreign Affairs on PAHO's lead role in coordination of donations to health -24 April 2020.
- f. The PAHO CO SPRP 9-pillar plan and budget were uploaded on the WHO COVID-19 Partners Platform on 21 April 2020.
- g. Planning meetings held with UNCT to further preparation of proposal for UN MPTF-April 18, 19 & 21, 2020
- Preparation of health sector COVID-19 plan and budget by pillars to guide resource mobilization, including for funding by USAID, CDC, USA and EU DEVCO
- i. Provision of laboratory test kits and PPEs to MOHW.
- 4. Case Management and IPC
  - **a.** Technical guidance on case management and IPC, including for a field hospital (EMT SARI), with PAHO Emergency Medical Team section
- 5. Research
  - Maintain membership on the Essential National Health Research Committee and provide support to formulate the research agenda for COVID-19, including for early investigations

# **NEEDS**

- 1. Jamaica
  - a. PPEs, laboratory supplies, equipment and supplies for isolation and quarantine facilities, wards and rooms
- 2. Bermuda: Information was requested on the procurement of pharmaceuticals.
- 3. Cayman Islands: No needs identified at this time.
