
This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.

- The key to controlling COVID-19 is the detection and isolation of all cases and the tracing and quarantine of their contacts.
- > To establish this capacity in the countries, it is recommended to establish and maintain case-based COVID-19 surveillance and to expand national capacity for laboratory confirmation.
- > The World Health Organization (WHO) continues to recommend that people who are contacts of laboratory-confirmed cases, be quarantined for 14 days from the last time they were exposed to a COVID-19 patient. This is because people infected with COVID-19 can still infect others after they stop feeling sick, WHO has recommended that people infected with COVID-19 isolate themselves for 2 weeks after they stop feeling sick.
- No treatment and vaccine exist yet but researchers around the world are working hard on this. So far, WHO has received applications for review and approval of 40 diagnostic tests, 50 vaccines are in development and many clinical trials of therapeutics are underway. We expect the first results in a few weeks.
- To ensure clear evidence of which treatments are most effective, WHO and its partners are organizing a large international study, the SOLIDARITY TRIAL, to compare different treatments in many countries and generate the robust data we need to show which treatments are the most effective.
- The trial provides simplified procedures to enable even hospitals that have been overloaded to participate.


