This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.




- The WHO has been closely following the effect of COVID-19 on children since the beginning of the outbreak, through its COVID-19 clinical network knowledge exchange platform, and alongside UNICEF.
- ➤ Data reported by countries continue to show that children have been infected with COVID-19 at lower rates than adults, and do not generally develop severe disease. Data received from countries have shown that mortality increases with older age however, a few cases of young adults and children who have died of COVID-19 have been reported.
- WHO is aware of the recent descriptions of children in some countries who have presented with an inflammatory syndrome similar to Kawasaki disease, with signs and symptoms of vasculitis, including gastrointestinal symptoms, rash, myocarditis and shock. These children are being treated with supportive care treatments.
- As of now, these cases remain rare. Laboratory investigations are ongoing, the WHO is awaiting more information to understand if and how this is related to COVID-19 virus.

- The WHO's networks of clinicians have been alerted about these clinical observations and encouraged to collect standardized clinical data and biological samples if such patients are detected, in order to improve our understanding and guide treatments.
- At all times, WHO works to ensure people have access to health services, and that work continues during this emergency. WHO is liaising with partners, including other UN agencies such as UNICEF, to address the issue of specific health care for pregnant women and children during an outbreak.

Donation of Ventilator to the Barbados Defence Force



As part of the Pan American Health Organization's (PAHO) commitment to support the response to Coronavirus disease (COVID- 19) pandemic in Barbados, the Health Emergencies Department of PAHO donated one ventilator with cruiser cart to the Barbados Defence Force (BDF).

On 30 April 2020, Dr Yitades Gebre, PAHO/WHO Representative to Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean Countries officially presented the ventilator to Colonel Glyne Grannum, Chief of Staff Barbados Defence Force at its headquarters, St. Ann's Fort base at The Garrison, St Michael. Also present at the handover was Retired Colonel Florence Gittens, Special Advisor to the BDF Chief of Staff for the Field Medical Facility.

The government of Canada approved the re-assignment of US \$50,000 from an existing Caribbean Disaster Risk Reduction project to support COVID-19 response in Barbados. Of this amount, \$44,000 is being used to support the Barbados Defence Force (BDF) to set up of an isolation facility.
