This situation update is on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) reported cases and deaths, Globally, Regionally, for Barbados and Eastern Caribbean Countries, French Territories, and the United Kingdom Overseas Territories.

Children and masks related to COVID-19

WHO advises that people always consult and abide by local authorities on recommended public health practices in their area. An international and multidisciplinary expert group brought together by WHO reviewed evidence on COVID-19 disease and transmission in children and the limited available evidence on the use of masks by children.

Based on this and other factors such as childrens' psychosocial needs and developmental milestones, WHO and UNICEF advise the following:

Children aged **5 years and under** should not be required to wear masks. This is based on the safety and overall interest of the child and the capacity to appropriately use a mask with minimal assistance.


Today 26 August 2020, Barbados recorded one more case, and the British Virgin Island 5 additional COVID-19 cases.







PAHO's Response

PAHO asks countries to reinforce contact tracing and data systems as the region starts to reopen



As cases of COVID-19 have more than doubled in the region of the Americas in the past weeks, reinforcing contact tracing and data management are key when many countries are reopening their activities.

The number of new COVID-19 infections reported in the Americas has more than doubled, rising from 5.3 million on July 1st to more than 12 million cases today

"Primary health care should be at the center of the response: identifying cases, acting to contain transmission and providing timely care in the community," the Director of the Pan American Health Organization, Dr. Carissa F. Etienne said during a press conference today. "Local health authorities have a central role to play in generating and analyzing data to adjust public health measures to the reality in each area".

Noting that in the past 6 weeks deaths in the region have doubled, Dr. Etienne said, "we can't stop all transmission, but if countries stay vigilant and expand testing and surveillance, they can better identify spikes in cases and act quickly to contain them before they spread out of control."
