Bridgetown, Barbados, January 19, 2021 (PAHO/ WHO) – Following the holidays there has been a surge in COVID-19 cases not only in Barbados but in many countries of the Eastern Caribbean.

At a ceremony to handover essential supplies and equipment to the Ministry of Health and Wellness, PAHO/WHO Representative for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean Countries, Dr Yitades Gebre said, "I am fully confident that the current outbreak in Barbados will be managed and contained if we apply the right intervention at the right time and at the right place."

Dr Gebre outlined that there was no one size fits all solutions for the current challenge and that countries should assess their risks, put in place mitigation

measures, and communicate the risks to citizens and communities

He noted the importance of improving surge capacity in the health system and seeking cooperation from the public, and that all measures must balance lives and livelihoods especially vulnerable people.

The Ministry of Health and Wellness received a timely donation of 20,000 rapid antigen based diagnostic test devices from PAHO. This donation follows a recent new health policy announced by the government of Barbados, the introduction of a rapid antigen diagnostic test during the 14-day quarantine period to reduce the length of quarantine.

- Antigua and Barbuda As of 20 January 2021, 2 new COVID-19 cases were reported.
- Barbados On January 20, 2021, an 83 year old man was reported as Barbados' 9th death from COVID-19

In a press briefing held January 20, 2021, Prime Minister Mia Amor Mottley reported that two new machines will arrive soon to assist with processing of COVID-19 test results. Additionally Cuban doctors and lab technicians are expected to arrive in Barbados by Friday, January 22; and a Virologist from PAHO early next week.

• **Saint Lucia** - On 21 January 2021 a 10th COVID-19 related death was announced, a 63 year old female. Thiry-seven new cases were also reported.

Effective 22 January 2021 stronger public health measures to be implemented including teleworking to reduce contact meeting, suspension of face to face class room teaching and prohibition of social and sporting activities.

PAHO's Response



Dominica presented with two vehicles to strengthen its response to the COVID-19 pandemic

Bridgetown, Barbados, 21 January 2021 (PAHO/WHO) – PAHO/WHO recently donated two vehicles to the Ministry of Health, Wellness and New Investment, as part of its continuous effort to assist Dominica in their COVID-19 response efforts.

On behalf of Dr Yitades Gebre, PAHO/WHO Representative for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean Countries, Ms Anneke Wilson, PAHO/WHO Country Program Specialist for Dominica handed over the keys to two new Hyundai H-1 vehicles to the Acting Minister for Health, Wellness and New Health Investment, Honourable Mr. Kent Edwards.

The vehicles were procured through the Pandemic Emergency Financing Facility (PEF) funded by the World Bank and coordinated by PAHO at a cost of US\$85,559.11 or EC\$230,000.00.

Ms Wilson said "the two vehicles were purchased to strengthen the Health System to prevent, rapidly detect, and effectively respond to any COVID-19 outbreak thereby reducing morbidity and mortality and the socio-economic impact from repeated lockdowns".


"PAHO is committed to support Dominica in their COVID-19 response efforts. Our trust is to assist in the prevention and control of the spread of COVID-19, inclusive of the prevention of Infection among health care workers. We continue to applaud the efforts of all Health Care workers and by extension the Ministry of Health in its response to the COVID 19 Pandemic," she said.

The vehicles are expected to assist in the transportation of the health team in the monitoring and evaluation of persons in quarantine and also to support transporting of visitors to and from the airport to quarantine facilities.

Acting Minister for Health, Wellness and New Health Investment, Honourable Mr. Kent Edwards, thanked PAHO for the vehicles, noting they will be used immediately as part of our COVID response. "The delivery of health and transportation go hand in hand, there can be no proper and efficient delivery of health without proper transportation," he said.

He again thanked PAHO as a partner in health, acknowledging appreciation for all the support provided from the start of the pandemic.
