

Situation Overview

- Seismic activity at La Soufrière, St Vincent has remained low since the tremor associated with the explosion and ash venting on 22 April.
- The Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines has lowered the volcanic alert level at La Soufrière to ORANGE based on recommendation from The University of the West Indies Seismic Research Centre (UWI-SRC).

Health Situation









- Teams of health personnel visit the shelters daily to administer COVID-19 vaccinations and tests; as well
 as carry out syndromic surveillance (Coughs, Fevers and Diarrhoea); none of these three symptoms were
 reported.

- *On June 10, 2021, the Ministry of Health reported 31 COVID-19 cases, 19 of these case were identified in Beguia.
- The Ministry of Health urges the public to exercise public health and social measures; to wear masks, practice hand hygiene, keep physical distance, and people with high-risk conditions and vulnerable for severe illness to receive vaccines to reduce the spread of COVID-19.
- Hemodialysis services are being provided by Evesham Health Centre, from April 29, 2021. Hemodialysis services continue to be provided at the Milton Cato Memorial Hospital, as well as a private facility in the green zone in the immediate term.

PAHO Response Actions (currently in progress)

Health Coordination/Logistics/General Assistance

- An Additional shipment of 8000 N95 masks and 10 water testing kits from Barbados arrived in SVG on 11th June 2021.
- PAHO facilitated a meeting Friday, 14th June 2021 between MOH (PS)/Central Medical Stores (CMS)/PAHO consultant Derek Hardy to discuss the logistics of supplies being provided/facilitated by PAHO on behalf of MOH
- PAHO supports the communication plan implemented by MoH to decrease vaccine hesitancy.
- PAHO is ready to support:
 - The implementation of the Early Warning, Alert and Response System (EWARS),
 - The set-up of a short-term air quality monitoring system,
 - The cleaning of health care facilities
 - The implementation of WASH interventions in priority facilities (selected by MoH)

- PAHO facilitates the use of the Annex to the H-EOC, and has supplied the furniture and several appliances. This facility will also be used for temporary storage of PAHO donations.
- PAHO is working with the World Food Program (WFP) to facilitate the distribution of cash assistance vouchers to approximately 180 displaced health care workers and their families.
- PAHO has commissioned a videographer to produce three (3) Public Service Announcements (PSA's) to support MOH Risk Communication on hygiene and sanitation, mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) and healthy eating for diabetics and hypertensives during disasters. PAHO has reviewed the scripts and will facilitate the production and airing of these PSAs.
- PAHO has facilitated the printing of posters (Ash cleaning and COVID-19 vaccines) for health care facilities and shelters.
- As requested by SVG government PAHO will support Post Disaster Needs Assessment (Health) conducted by UNDP.

Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MPHSS)

- PAHO is working with Ministry of Health on the implementation of the proposed MHPSS strategy.
- A mapping exercise to identify MHPSS support provided by supporting organizations was finalized to improve coordination. Report will be shared with MoH and health partners.
- MHPSS and Psychological First Aid (PFA): A capacity building session is being organized for front-line workers on the provision of psychosocial support and basic self-care principles. Participants will be required to complete an online Psychological First Aid (PFA) course, a 12-hour self-paced training before June 8, 2021. (PFA course is available at: https://www.campusvirtualsp.org/en/course/psychological-first-aid-pfa-disaster-management-caribbean-second-edition-2020) On successful completion of this course and the issuance of a certificate, a series of three webinars will be convened:
 - Monday, June 14, 2021, 2:30-3:30pm Webinar 1. Coordination and follow up session.
 - Wednesday, June 16, 2021, 2:30-3:30pm Webinar 2. Presentation on MHPSS intervention.
 - Wednesday, June 23, 2021, 10:00-11:00am Webinar 3 Presentation on Self-Care Training: Doing what matters in times of stress.

Non-communicable Diseases (NCD)

- PAHO purchases 3 Non-Communicable Disease (NCD) kits. Each kit is estimated to provide medicines and medical supplies for a population of 10,000 persons for 3 months for the management of diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, and cardiovascular disease. The estimated date of delivery is 16 August 2021, for the first component.
- PAHO is supporting one month of transport of Public Health Teams. including support for the displaced Nutritionist who provided services at the Dialysis Unit in Georgetown. She has been provided temporary accommodation in the Argyle area, and now supports this service at Evesham. PAHO is facilitating transportation for Nutritionists to service antenatals, diabetics, hypertensives and persons with NCDs who are based in public and private shelters.

Water, Sanitation and Health (WASH)

- PAHO team continues to update the health care facilities database for WASH interventions. Results and priorities for WASH (and backup power) interventions are discussed with MoH SVG for approval.
- WASH working group meeting took place on 11th June 2021 at the Health-EOC Annex

Health Partner Activities

- UNFPA has provided guidance tools for distribution of Dignity Kits and strongly advises all partners who
 are planning on distributing the kits to follow this guidance, as well as global guidelines and minimum
 standards.
- UNFPA has been providing ongoing technical guidance to the Ministry of Health and the Family Planning Association on provision and access to SRH services and information for the affected populations
- UNFPA supported the Ministry of Health to map the health facilities to emergency shelters. An assessment report was prepared with key recommendations for further action
- UNFPA partnered with the OECS Commission to train 11 key personnel from health, gender, emergency and civil society on the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) for Reproductive Health in emergencies. An Action Plan was developed with key interventions to inform both response and recovery phases.
- UNFPA is supporting strengthening of the health system to provide comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services as part of the recovery phase
- WFP is supporting PAHO logistics and providing food vouchers, cash transfers to displaced health care workers and vulnerable groups.
- IOM is supporting with providing accommodation for displaced health care workers and assistance in MHPSS.
- UNWOMAN, UNICEF, IOM and IFRC are also helping in MHPSS




Figure 1. Map showing location of Health Care Facilities
