<p>The history of VWA dates to a 2002 proposal by the Ministers of Health of the Andean Region, following the last indigenous measles outbreak in the Americas. This proposal called for a coordinated vaccination effort across national borders to reach vulnerable populations, put an end to the outbreak, and prevent future outbreaks. Today, the Region of the Americas is facing new measles outbreaks, after having been declared free of this disease in 2016.</p> <p>VWA 2020 is a great opportunity for all the countries of the Region to do their part to end the current outbreaks of measles, protect their communities, and permanently eliminate the measles virus in the Americas.</p>
