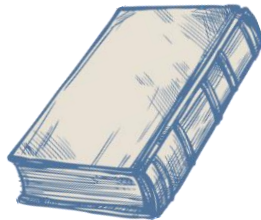
INTRODUCTION

REMIT OF THE CCJ CONCERNING NCDS

- Substantive rights in the Revised Treaty of Chaguaramas (RTC).
- Institutional rights under the RTC.
- Access to the Court, particularly in the Original Jurisdiction under RTC Art. 222, as a vehicle for advancing the NCD agenda.
