Goal

Contribute to reducing premature mortality from breast cancer through early detection strategies and access to treatment.

- Substantially increase breast cancer training of health professionals
- Education of the community on breast cancer early signs



Breast cancer landscape in The Bahamas

- Breast cancer incidence and mortality rates in The Bahamas are among the highest in the world (the highest in the Americas).
- 23% of Bahamian women diagnosed with invasive breast cancer carry the BRCA1/2 gene mutations the highest prevalence for any country studied to date.





Strategy


- Assess evidence and identify critical needs.

Accomplishments

- Funded genetic studies leading to the discovery that 23% of Bahamian women diagnosed with breast cancer carry the BRCA1 gene mutation.
- Trained breast health educators to deliver breast cancer awareness messages and conduct community outreach.
- Developed/ distributed educational materials.
- Assisted underserved women through the provision of equipment like port-a-caths to reduce their discomfort during treatment.



Forward-Looking

- Seek alliances and coalitions to work together to identify best practices, build consensus, and provide a unified voice about the unmet needs, critical issues and direction of breast cancer research, policy and care.
- Direct efforts towards working collaboratively with other organizations to achieve common goals. Build partnerships that leverage expertise, assets, resources and interests.
