The World Together: Establishment of an intergovernmental negotiating body to strengthen pandemic prevention, preparedness and response

The Second special session of the World Health Assembly,

Mandate: to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response, with a view to adoption under Article 19, or under other provisions of the WHO Constitution as may be deemed appropriate by INB.

#### Report by the Director-General

1. The Director-General has the honour to transmit to the Seventy-seventh World Health Assembly the outcome of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body (INB) to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response (see Annex), in line with decision SSA2(5) (2021).

#### **Intergovernmental Negotiating Body**

The Seventy-seventh World Health Assembly.

(PP1) Recalling decision SSA2(5) (2021), entitled "The World Together: Establishment of an intergovernmental negotiating body to strengthen pandemic prevention, preparedness and response", which established the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body (INB) to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response, with a view to adoption under Article 19, or under other provisions of the WHO Constitution;

(PP2) Recalling that the INB agreed, at its second session, that the instrument should be legally binding and contain both legally binding as well as non-legally binding elements, and identified that Article 19 of the WHO Constitution is the comprehensive provision under which the instrument should be adopted, without prejudice to also considering, as work progresses, the suitability of Article 21;

#### Decided:

(1) to extend the mandate of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Body to draft and negotiate a WHO convention, agreement or other international instrument on pandemic prevention, preparedness and response to finish its work as soon as possible, and submit its outcome for consideration by the Seventy-eighth World Health Assembly in 2025, or earlier by a special session of the World Health Assembly if possible in 2024 with only one agenda item dedicated to this outcome;

### **Collective Responsibility**



## Regional Collaboration

Coordinated efforts between PAHO/WHO, and Member States towards a unified approach.



#### **Health Equity**

Ensuring equitable access to vaccines, healthcare resources, and technology for all especially vulnerable populations in the Region.



### Strengthening Health Surveillance, early alert and response

Building regional capacity to alert and respond to public health emergencies.

# Challenges To Meaningful Participation of Member States from in the Americas in Pandemic Negotiations

#### **Time Zone Differences**

Negotiations begin at 9am Geneva, 3am or earlier in most countries

#### **Resource Constraints**

Many permanent missions from the Americas face limited personnel

#### **Communication Challenges**

Maintaining effective communication between missions and capitals

#### **Participation Asymmetry**

These factors hinder the ability of countries in the Americas to advocate effectively for their needs.

## Information Sessions

Including public sector, civil society, Industry, relevant stakeholders and interactive dialogues with experts



## Structured Decision-Making

A procedural framework to allow Member States to propose text editing and review key articles systematically.



## Technical Working Groups

Provide a forum for in-depth informal discussions on critical topics.

#### **Expert Contributions**


Technical experts from WHO and PAHO provided essential insights
