
UICC has been the first publisher (Vols. 1-2) of "Cancer Incidence in Five Continents", with data from the World Report of Cancer Registries












IARC



 Sessions on data from cancer registries are regularly included in the WCC Scientific Programs (Washington 2006; Geneva 2008; Shenzen 2010 ...)




By Population



Coverage


Total population coverage has increased.

The number of countries covered remains more or less the same. There are more registries in affluent countries and a stable number in low-middle income countries, as a balance between new entries and disappearances

UICC - Cancer Registry (CR) Partnership

Based on the World Cancer Declaration

- Measurement of the global cancer burden

- National Cancer Control Plans

- Measure *
- Plan *
- Act
- Evaluate *

^{*} CR data needed

3 main fields

- Help increase registration coverage
 - where absent (priority)
 - where insufficient
 - always on local basis
- Support staff training
- Make data available
 - Provide data (see Dr. Bravo's presentation to the "My Child Matters" Project)

In strong cooperation with WHO, IARC, IACR

Two main types

- 1 Grant to a single person for a residency
 - The award is a partial contribution to the recipient to help cover travel costs and the stipend given to cover living costs.
- 2 Sending a small group of university faculty (2-3 professors/researchers) to a (usually low/middle-income) country for a short course aimed at a local/national/regional audience
 - Recipients must be international faculty members.
 - These workshops are only carried out in resource-constrained countries.

A total of **2191** fellowships were awarded from 1996 to 2009 (August),

out of which **96** (4.4 %) were granted to cancer registry personnel.

Among the most frequent topics of the training/cooperation were:

- A cancer registry as an institution of data origination or destination
- Registrars
- Techniques
- Data analysis
- Screening and evaluation

Of the **96**, **88** (91.7 %) were personal grants

8 (8.3 %) were short courses




